

Barnsley Museums Makes: Twisted Beasts Headdress

Beasts, Beasts Everywhere! John Malby's Angel and Lion Sculpture is a favourite in the Cooper Gallery. Why not make a Twisted Beast headdress inspired by the beasts you find in the Cooper Gallery to wear on your own hunt for the Twisted Beasts this Spring Bank Holiday?

double-sided sticky tape Natural objects- leaves, twigs etc. to decorate Colouring pens, pencils or crayons Scissors



Open up your cereal packet and lay it flat. Using a ruler, draw a strip lengthwise which is 10cm wide and cut out.



Bend your strip so that it fits around your head and sticky tape it in place.



Decorate your headdress. Use interestingly shaped leaves to create ears for your animal. Dock leaves make great rabbit ears!



Next, use your pencil or pens to create the other features of your animal.



Make your animal features bold so that they stand out. You may find other natural things that you could also stick to your crown.



Think about the other animals and birds you could make as a headdress. How many can you think of?
