## Georgian pastimes: Georgian peg dolls

In Georgian times, children would have peg dolls to play with. They were made from wooden clothes pegs and decorated to look like tiny people. Have a go at making your own peg doll using things around the house.

## You will need:

A wooden peg Glue stick Pen or pencil for drawing the face Any collage bits, eg, scraps of fabric, paper, ribbon, wool Felt tips (can use to decorate if don't have collage) Scissors

## If using collage bits, decide on your outfit for your doll



Glue the top of the peg and add in hair using some wool, string or strips or paper.



Glue the bottom half of the peg with glue and wrap around a small square of fabric (or you can colour in with one of the felt tip colours to add trousers or stick on paper).



Draw in a face with a pencil or thin pen, you can add details to the clothes with pens, sequins, any collage bits you have.



Glue the top half of the peg and stick on a small square of paper, add two strips for arms. Or again, you can add colour with felt tips



Have a go at making a collection of peg dolls using more found materials, add hats, belts and scarves. Or simply colour or paint!
