Salt Dough Shell Art

You will need:

salt dough
rolling pin
garlic press
string / garden twine
shells
pebbles
hessian or background material


Some ideas to make your own salt dough shell art...



- Roll out the salt dough into your chosen shape about 1 cm in depth.
- Use the handle of a spoon or a pencil to mark in two holes at the top of the shape to thread your string or garden twine through after baking.
- Use salt dough in the garlic press to make clumps of sea weed, anemones and coral.
- Make small balls of the salt dough and press shells into it then place on shape.
- Roll a long sausage of dough and spiral round, marking lines across the spiral.



- Roll out the salt dough into your chosen shape about 1 cm in depth.
- Use the handle of a spoon or a pencil to mark in two holes at the top of the shape to thread your string or garden twine through after baking.
- When baked thread the string / twine through the plaque.
- Use PVA glue to stick on your favourite shells or pebbles.



- Use a spring frame with hessian under. Arrange shells or pebbles. Take a photo of your design. Print out and mount in spring frame.

Salt dough— your usual recipe or try

1 cup plain flour
1 cup salt
1 cup warm water
Mix the flour and salt together. Add in the water a tablespoon at a time until the mixture forms a ball of dough.
