Pukka Pastels

Convenient and quick to use, artists from Turner to Nevinson have used pastels, chalks and pastels to artwork that shows a fleeting impression of a place or moment.

Follow our step by step instructions to give pastels a go. What could be a more fleeting image to capture than a bubble floating on the wind?




You will need:

- Dark/ coloured sugar or pastel paper
- Pastels or chalks
- Something round to draw around
- Kitchen roll (optional)
- Hair spray or fixative (optional)



Use different sized round objects to draw around to get your circles. No need to use a pencil, just draw around your object in white chalk or pastel



Add a little line and a dot at the edge of each one to start making your bubbles look 3D. try and draw these details at around the same point in all your circles.



Add some curved lines just inside your bubble in different colours use a bit of kitchen roll or your finger to blend the colours. Try not to smudge your white lines



Now experiment with lots of different colours.

Once you are happy with your artwork why not ask an adult to spray it with either hairspray or fixative to keep it from smudging?
