Learn about primary colours and  
how to mix secondary colours with  
this simple activity

You will need:

A paper plate  
A pencil  
Paint in red, yellow and blue  
A paint brush  
Water pot



Fold your paper plate in half



Carefully fold your half into thirds.  
You might need a grown up to  
help you do this



Unfold your plate and mark in  
pencil along the creases



Using every other segment colour  
in using your 3 primary colours,  
red, yellow and blue. Primary  
colours are very important. You  
can use these colours to make  
any other colour but they are  
special and you can't make them  
yourself



Now look at your plate. You are  
going to make your secondary  
colours. Look at your empty  
segments and mix the two colours  
together from each side of them.  
This shows you which secondary  
colours that the primary colours  
make. Be careful to wash out  
your brush inbetween or you will  
end up with a mucky bown!



What colour does red and yellow  
make?  
What colour does red and blue  
make?  
What colour does blue and  
yellow make?

You have now made a colour  
wheel
