Top Trophies



You will need:

- An empty plastic drinks bottle
- Cereal box card
- Scissors
- Tin foil
- Cellotape
- PVA glue or glue stick



Barnsley Football Club have won two famous football trophies. In 1912 they won The FA Cup. Then in 2016 they won The Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

How about making your own trophy at home? you could even use it as the prize for the Ultimate Obstacle Course!



Start with an empty pop bottle. Cutting pop bottles can be tricky so have a grown up at hand to help with the cutting bits.



Cut the top third from the bottle and keep to one side, remove the middle third and throw away. Turn the bottom third upside down and place the upside down top third on it and fix with PVA.



Make two cardboard handles from an empty cereal box. Draw one and fold card before cutting to make a double sided handle.



Repeat to make a second handle.



Attach handles at either side of the trophy with tape.



Finally cover with strips of foil securing with PVA. You can make a name for your trophy by covering a cardboard shape with foil, writing it onto the foil and sticking onto the front.
