

However from 1898 the Barnsley FC have been kitted out in the red you see today.

You will need:


Paper

These are basic starting shapes, you can change this to a V neck, add a collar or have long sleeves.



On the front of most Football shirts there is a team badge on left hand side of the chest and a sponsor's name or logo on the tummy.




Here are some ideas for a team badge and good cause sponsor logos.

On the back you can have your name and a number, it could be your age, house number or any number which is special to you.




