



Cave Art

The earliest known cave paintings in Britain are thought to be 12,000 years old and found at Creswell Crags in Derbyshire.



Why not try different techniques to create your own cave art and pin up in your Cave Den?



You will need:

- Brown paper or sugar paper
- Paint, chalk or pastels
- Cave painting Dice Game sheet
- Dice



Try drawing around hand using paint sticks, chalk or pastels. Add extra outlines and dots to make an interesting effect.



Use a brush to flick paint on the paper, making a hand silhouette (best done outside or with a table cloth and apron and lots of care!)
