

Barnsley Museums Makes: 3D Elephant Collage




You will need:

Template for body & legs
Scissors
Glue
Googly eyes
Coloured paper, sparkles
Pen
Card for ears
Corrugated cardboard for
body & legs



You can use recycled cardboard to make this colourful 3D elephant collage.



Draw around the templates onto corrugated cardboard.



Cut out the pieces.



Rip up or cut squares of brightly coloured paper. You can also use sparkles to decorate your elephant.



Don't forget to decorate both sides of the template.



Slot your elephant together so that he stands up.



You can use pipe cleaners to make tusks and a tail. Stick or draw on googly eyes. What a colourful elephant!

Barnsley Museums Makes: Weaving Elmer



You will need:
Elephant template
Strips of coloured paper
Scissors
Pencil
Glue



Have a go at weaving to make your own brightly coloured and individual Elmer!



Cut out your Elmer template.



Use a ruler or something straight to draw straight lines around 2cm apart.



Cut along the lines to make slits in the template.



Weave the strips of paper through the slits.




Stick the strips down and cut off any extra paper. If you want, you can then add further decoration.
