

Winterval: Flying Geese Gift Tag

On the sixth day of Christmas my true love gave to me, 6 geese a laying...

Have you seen the 12 days of Christmas trail on our Cannon Hall Facebook page and website? There are lots of activities and recipes to do celebrating Christmas past.

This activity is inspired by traditional patchwork quilts. Did you know that the different patterns on quilts have names. A pattern made with lots of right angled triangles is called Flying Geese because of how they look when flying in formation. Why not make your own flying geese gift tags?



Coloured card
Brightly coloured paper

Glue stick

Ruler

Pencil

Hole punch


Scissors

Ribbon





Draw out your gift tag on your coloured card - I made mine 10cm x 6 cm. Once you have drawn out one you can use it as a template to make more.



Draw a grid on coloured paper and then add diagonal lines to make lots of right angled triangles and cut them out. Use different coloured and patterned paper



Feed the 2 ends of the ribbon through the loop and pull tight.



Arrange your triangles in a pattern. when you are happy glue them on.







Use a hole punch to make a hole at the end. Cut some ribbon and fold in half. Push the centre fold through the hole.



Use your finished gift tags to jazz up your gifts.
