LOCAL HISTORY

Trips:

World War Two: Sent to the Country – KS1/KS2 – Cannon Hall Museum and Country Park – Full day workshop - £9.25 per pupil

Pupils meet the Cook and Housekeeper at Cannon Hall and become evacuees for the day in this immersive workshop. They will take part in traditional wartime activities, view real and replica objects and discover how to make tasty treats, even during rationing!

Victorian Kitchen - KS1/KS2 - Cannon Hall Museum and Country Park - Full day workshop - £9.25 per pupil

Your pupils will transform into Victorian servants for the day as they become immersed in history to help our Cook and Housekeeper prepare for the Master's party. They will cook a meal on our Victorian range, take part in traditional activities, and take an historical tour of Cannon Hall.

Deep Down Underground - KS2 -Experience Barnsley Museum - Full or half day workshop - £9.25/£5.25 per pupil

Pupils will explore coal mining in Barnsley using objects and maps from our inspiring archive and museum collections. They will handle mining objects, explore the Experience Barnsley exhibition, understand map progression over time and analyse real census documents to learn about a real Barnsley family and how they lived their lives.

Mill Tour – KS1/KS2 - Worsbrough Mill and Country Park – Half day workshop - £5.25 per pupil

Discover the history of the Mill through the ages and explore the stories of the people who have lived and worked here. Tours last approximately 90 minutes and can be supplemented with a self-led visit around the nature reserve.

Stone Age to Iron Age – Lower KS2 – Experience Barnsley Museum – Full or half day workshop - £9.25/£5.25 per pupil

Bring prehistory to life as your class discover how to be archaeologists for the day. Pupils will understand chronology, discover the differences between the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age, examine replica objects, and take part in traditional prehistoric activities such as soap knapping and food 'foraging'. Pupils will explore the Experience Barnsley exhibition.

Outreach:

Deep Down Underground - KS2 - Full or half day session - £8.50/£4.50 per pupil

Explore Barnsley's coal mining community in your classroom by getting hands on with objects and archive materials. Your pupils will examine maps and census documents to discover more about mining life in the Borough.

Stone Age to Iron Age – Lower KS2– Full or half day session – £8.50/£4.50 per pupil

Bring prehistory to life in your classroom as your pupils become archaeologists for the day. They will understand the chronology of the prehistoric period, discover the differences between Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age, categorise replica objects, and take part in traditional prehistoric activities such as soap knapping and food 'foraging'.

Online workshops

Virtual Victorians - KS1/KS2 - £60

Bring your Victorians topic to life in the classroom with our live 45 minute online workshop! Meet the Cook or Housekeeper from Cannon Hall and ask them questions about their job. Watch our video tour of the Hall and take a sneak peak behind the scenes in the Servants' quarters. Then help us get ready for the Master's party that evening.

Workshop fee includes access to all films, follow-up activity worksheets and additional information about the Hall, a pre-session conversation with the facilitator and the workshop itself.

The session supported the children in their understanding of the objects and therefore their ability to add the information into their role play. It enabled a rich vocabulary to be added to their narratives and we saw the level of understanding that the children had achieved from the session through their play

World War Two: Evacuees Online -KS1/KS2 - £60

Bring your WW2 topic to life in the classroom with this live 45 minute zoom session! Meet a member of the Women's Voluntary Service and find out all about their daily life at Cannon Hall during WW2. Then have a go at some WW2 activities to see what life would have been like for an evacuee in the war.

Workshop fee includes access to all films, followup activity worksheets and resources, a presession conversation with the facilitator and the workshop itself.

Coal Mining - KS2 - £55 per half term

Discover Barnsley's mining heritage from protests to pit ponies with our interactive 'talking' loan box. Let our objects speak for themselves as they tell you about the history of the Borough and its communities. Lesson plans and suggested activities are provided alongside the box.

Explore life as a Butler or Housekeeper with our Victorian Servant loan box.

Our collection of real-life Victorian objects, along with a detailed information pack, will give your class a window into life as a servant during Victorian times at Cannon Hall and beyond.

MATHS:

Trips:

Sublime Symmetry – Upper KS2 - Half day session – £5.25 per pupil

Let us bring a creative twist to your Maths Curriculum by introducing your class to the angles, shapes and symmetry in the work of Victorian ceramic artist William De Morgan. Pupils will handle real objects, use protractors and compasses and finish the session by using maths to design their own artwork. This session is perfect for recapping geometry topics.

It allowed children to explore different mathematical concepts and relate them to art. A very enjoyable session that links very well to what Ofsted is looking for, especially with deep dives

- Pupils will recognise angles as a property of a shape
- Pupils will identify lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes
- Pupils will learn about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers

The above is also available as a half day outreach session at £4.50 per pupil





ENGLISH:

Trips:

Creative nature writers – Upper KS2 -Wentworth Castle Gardens – Half day workshop - £5.25 per pupil

This outdoor creative writing workshop is perfect for recapping English composition techniques with your class. Pupils will be inspired by the beautiful landscapes and natural spaces of the gardens to develop initial ideas for poems to be built on back in the classroom.

Pupils will create settings, characters and plot
Pupils will note and develop initial ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary

Creative writing - Upper KS2 -Cooper Gallery or Cannon Hall -Half day workshop -£5.25 per pupil

Let your pupils' imaginations run wild, inspired by the wonderful objects and artworks at Cannon Hall or the Cooper Gallery. This workshop is the perfect opportunity to stimulate ideas for writing composition. Pupils will take a tour of the museum and then let their creative juices flow, developing ideas for a deeper focus back in the classroom.



Pupils will draft and write by selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning
Pupils will note and develop initial ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary

SCIENCE:

Trips:

A Material World - KS2 - Elsecar Heritage Centre -Full or half day workshop - £9.25/£5.25 per pupil

Explore Elsecar, handle objects and see the magnificent Newcomen Beam Engine in action in this full or half day STEM workshop. Pupils will learn about different materials used at Elsecar now and in the past and create their own piece of art inspired by industrial materials.



- Pupils will identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock
- Pupils will describe the simple physical properties of everyday materials
- Pupils will use a range of art materials creatively to design and make products

Loan boxes:



Industry and physical processes - KS2 -£55 per half term

Learn about the coal mining and ironworks processes at Elsecar through practical experiments and discovery of important inventions which helped put this village on the international map. Find out about the reactions and physical processes which helped drive the industrial revolution and link with your local history study...

Nature and biodiversity - KS1 -£55 per half term

Let the flora and fauna of Worsbrough Country Park introduce your class to some of the basics of the KS1 science Curriculum, including plants, animals, habitats and seasonal changes. Meet the different species that live at Worsbrough and find out what they need in order to survive. Pupils will identify living things and their habitats

- Pupils will learn about seasonal changes and observe changes across the four seasons
- Pupils will explore the difference between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive

ART AND DESIGN:

Trips:

Portraits and self-identity - KS1/KS2 - The Cooper Gallery - Full or half day workshop - £9.25/£5.25 per pupil

Pupils will become immersed in original works from the Cooper Gallery collection, learning new ways of looking at and interpreting art. Focussing on portraits by local artists, they will learn the basic principles of portraiture while developing their sketching skills.

 Pupils learn to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experience and imagination.

 Pupils learn to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials; for example pencil, charcoal, paint and clay.

Outreach:

Portraits and self-identity - KS1/KS2 - Half day session - £4.50 per pupil

Your pupils will become artists for this two-hour session where they will learn the basics of portraiture including proportion and detailed drawing of facial features. They will develop and improve a range of drawing techniques whilst being inspired by works of art from the Cooper Gallery collection.

Self-led visits

Barnsley Museums offers self-led visits to all of our sites free of charge. We ask all visiting groups, including self-led, to book with us in advance either via our website or by email. We offer lunch spaces for self-led groups at Worsbrough Mill and Experience Barnsley at a cost of £30.

Accessibility

Our workshops can be adapted to support any specific educational needs your group may have including home education, SEND, or gifted and talented groups.

Arts Award

Barnsley Museums supports Arts Award delivery and offers three Discover in a Day workshops - 'Look, Make, Print' and 'Portraits and selfidentity' at the Cooper Gallery and 'A Material World' at Elsecar Heritage Centre. Your pupils will receive a bespoke Barnsley Museums logbook and we will process the administration and moderation of the award. Please contact us to discuss prices and availability for these sessions. If you are delivering Arts Award in school, our other workshops can help fulfil certain elements. Please contact us to discuss details of your Award.



Terms and Conditions

We can take a maximum of 36 children per class, per workshop which must include appropriate adult to child ratios. All adults are free of charge.

Please note that once you have filled in and returned your booking form, your booking is finalised. In the event that you wish to cancel a workshop after returning your form, the following cancellation fees will be charged (unless your cancellation is related to Covid-19 in which case all fees are waived):

If the trip is cancelled a month before the booking, no cancellation fee will be charged. If the trip is cancelled between one month and one week in advance of the booking, we will in the first instance look to rearrange the visit. If this is not possible, 50% of the workshop fee will be charged.

If the trip is cancelled within one week of the booking, we will in the first instance look to rearrange the visit. If this is not possible, the full workshop fee will be charged.

Our minimum charges for workshops are as follows

- Half day session £100
- Full day session £150
- Victorian Kitchen or World War Two session £200

Please note that teachers and adult helpers are responsible for students' behaviour and safety at all times. All group leaders should carry out their own Risk Assessment prior to the visit.







All trips and outreach sessions are led by a member of our highly experienced Learning team. Each activity or resource comes with a full Risk Assessment, is tailored to the National Curriculum and has been adapted to be Covid-secure, with increased ventilation, cleaning and hygiene policies in place.

We will always follow latest government guidance in regard to Covid-19 safety measures. Trips and outreach come with a pre-visit phone call to discuss the structure of your day, and we strongly encourage a familiarisation visit before a class trip to any of our venues.
