## Tut' 22: the life of Tutankhamun

Until 18 Mar 2023

Barnsley Museums are celebrating 'the greatest archaeological discovery of all time' with a unique exhibition curated by Barnsley-born Egyptologist Prof. Joann Fletcher.

Following last year's centenary of the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun in 1922, 2023 marks the centenary of the opening of its burial chamber, whose contents gave the world its first glimpse into the life and death of Egypt's most famous pharaoh. The exhibition 'Tut 22: the life of Tutankhamun' explores royal life in C.14th BC Egypt and the Barnsley links to the story of the famous 'boy king'.

Focusing on Tutankhamun's birthplace at the city of Amarna, the exhibition features over 270 ancient artefacts, including some never displayed before. These are all being loaned by Bolton Museum's renowned Egyptian collection, first assembled by curators William and Thomas Midgley whose family came from Cawthorne, Barnsley. The exhibition also acknowledges the role of Barnsley-born artist-turned-archaeologist Harold Jones, whose excavations in the Valley of the Kings uncovered the first clues to the location of Tutankhamun's tomb which was eventually discovered by Jones' friends Lord Carnarvon and Howard Carter.



**Resurrecting Ancient Egypt: A Monumental Yorkshire Journey** A Touring Exhibition from Barnsley Museums

This exclusively commissioned body of work by Kyte Photography, designed and curated by Professor Joann Fletcher, looks at the Egyptian inspired architecture found throughout Yorkshire. It reflects the West's enduring fascination with Egypt's ancient monuments, long regarded as the ultimate symbols of immortality, copied and constructed for centuries right across Europe.

**Henry Moore: Threads of Influence spans Henry Moore's career, from early life drawings and carvings to iconic drawings and late prints and demonstrates the multiple facets of Moore's practice. A range of related objects will illuminate Moore's work in a new way, demonstrating how disparate cultures and contexts informed him.**

**A range of related objects from The Cooper Gallery Collection will sit alongside the display.**

**Key objects are two early life drawings of his wife Irina, and demonstrate how Moore's commitment to studying the human form laid the foundations for his ongoing sculptural practice.**

*Sculptural Object in Landscape* (1939) and *Reclining Figures for Metal Sculpture* (1940) portray how Moore was conceiving monumental sculpture before he had the means to achieve this vast scale in three dimensions. The exhibition includes four Shelter Drawings inspired by the

scenes in the London Underground during the Blitz. As an Official War Artist, Moore's drawings of the subject were displayed at the National Gallery during the War, and they propelled him to fame before his sculpture was widely known.

It explores Moore's influence over the years, from artists such as Henri Gaudier-Brzeska and Jacob Epstein to ancient sculpture from Mexico and beyond.

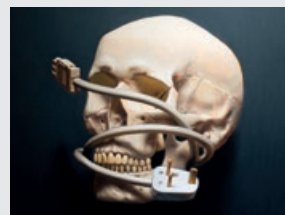
The Cooper collection features two figurative drawings by Moore, which will be on display as part of the exhibition.

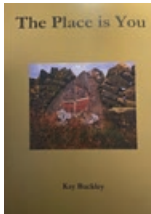

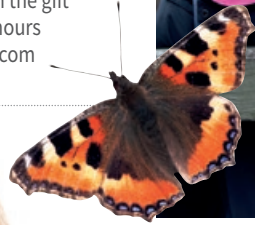
